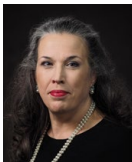

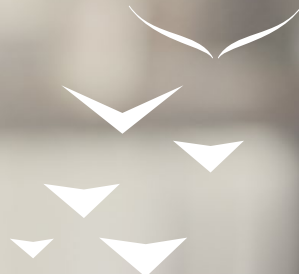

▶ A DAUGHTER'S JOURNEY:

THE STORY OF THE HONORABLE VERDA M. COLVIN



For Superior Court Judge Verda M. Colvin, the journey to recovery is just as personal to her as those who seek treatment from River Edge. When she was just 19 years old, Judge Colvin learned her father had bipolar disorder, which explained the confusion she felt as a child. “All of my life I knew this gentlemen. He was the life of the party. He was so philosophical. But there was always something that was a little off.”

Now, she’s using her story — and her father’s story — to help others by destigmatizing mental illness. “I thought about it long and hard — that secrets keep us sick,” she said. “My father did very well within his career — he didn’t graduate from college, but he worked for the federal government. There is no face to mental health illness. I love my father and I’m so proud of who he was, and who he is, in my world. And so, I want to say to everyone who struggles in that way: own it. Don’t live a secret.”

Judge Colvin’s childhood and her father’s diagnosis, though challenging, led her to where she is meant to be: behind the bench. After passing the bar and practicing as a successful attorney, Judge Colvin became a Superior Court Judge and now presides over Macon’s Mental Health Court, where all too often she witnesses the toll of addiction and mental illness on individuals, families, and communities.

It costs about \$52 a day to keep someone in the Bibb County Law Enforcement Center, according to Judge Colvin. But, with effective treatment and an alternative to incarceration, the Macon-Bibb Mental Health Court saved the Bibb County Sheriff’s Department over \$60,000 in its first quarter of 2016.

“River Edge is our biggest provider of treatment and medication. It’s our saving grace,” she said. “If we could only realize that our investment in ensuring that people have the best mental healthcare possible would give us more of what we need as a society, we would be better off — individually and collectively,” she said.

There is no deeper truth than what Judge Colvin reiterates to those who stand before her bench starting their new journeys to mental health recovery: “We’re all in this together, and none of us are better than the other person.”

▶ TINA'S JOURNEY:

CHALLENGED, FULFILLED, & PART OF A TEAM

“I think this experience has been good for Tina. I know it has been good for us.”

When Fred Morgan, owner of Macon Office Supplies, hired Tina Wheeler through River Edge’s supported employment service, he knew the opportunity would have a huge impact on her life. He didn’t realize, though, the profound impact Tina would have on his staff.

Tina joined the Macon Office Supply team in 2016 and quickly became a valued member of the staff, where she is a contributor and regular part of the company’s work week. But perhaps more importantly, Tina found a way to bring the team together during a time of uncertainty. Her wholehearted support of a coworker undergoing chemotherapy brought the staff together in ways Fred couldn’t imagine. “Tina called all of us together and led us in a very beautiful prayer,” Fred said. “It was unrehearsed, straight from the heart, and surely God heard it loud and clear — and answered it as well: our employee finished his chemo, had a good outcome, and is now doing fine. Tina did this all on her own with no prompting from anyone on our staff. It was so heartfelt and a wonderful thing to be a part of.”

River Edge’s Supported Employment service helps individuals with behavioral health, intellectual, or developmental disabilities lead meaningful, productive lives by emphasizing competitive work in the community with supports that encourage success. River Edge’s goal is to ensure its clients are placed in jobs in an integrated setting with competitive pay that are based on the individual’s strengths and motivations.

Fred said Supported Employment has helped his staff see beyond a person’s disabilities. “It’s helped us better see that among the abilities — and natural rights — of those who have disabilities is the potential to be challenged and fulfilled and to be part of a team. Tina is part of our team,” he said. “I think this experience has been good for Tina; I know it has been good for us.”





▶ BRETT'S STORY: TURNING A MESS INTO A MESSAGE

Brett Coppock's childhood seemed perfect on the outside. She lived in an upper-middle class household, was privately educated, and had everything she needed. However, growing up was anything but easy. Her parents married and divorced twice before she was 10. She moved constantly, and the resulting feelings of instability and uncertainty left her angry and wondering about her place in the world.

After a successful college career, Brett completed flight school and earned her commercial pilot's license. Soon after, she met and married a doctor thinking her dream of love and stability had come true. She thought she had it all.

After falling from her horse, she was introduced to a pain medication that quickly became her drug of choice and changed her life forever. Despite her addiction, Brett continued to lead a seemingly normal life. She returned to school to pursue a career in criminal justice before working as a sheriff's deputy for the county in which she lived. That's when her trouble with the law began. "When I was arrested for prescription fraud, it was by a fellow police officer. That was one of my lowest points, however there were many more to come," she said.

Ultimately Brett found herself before a judge. Her choices became clear: treatment or prison.

Brett arrived at the River Edge Recovery Center and followed advice given to seek long-term residential treatment. After seven months, she returned to her family and has maintained her sobriety for seven years. She decided to turn her "mess into a message" for others still suffering.

Brett, a mother of three, is happily remarried and has a wonderful supportive family. She shares her story to encourage others on their own recovery journeys.

Brett is a member of The River Edge Foundation Board of Trustees. She is an advocate and speaks publicly about her journey in an effort to help others still suffering.

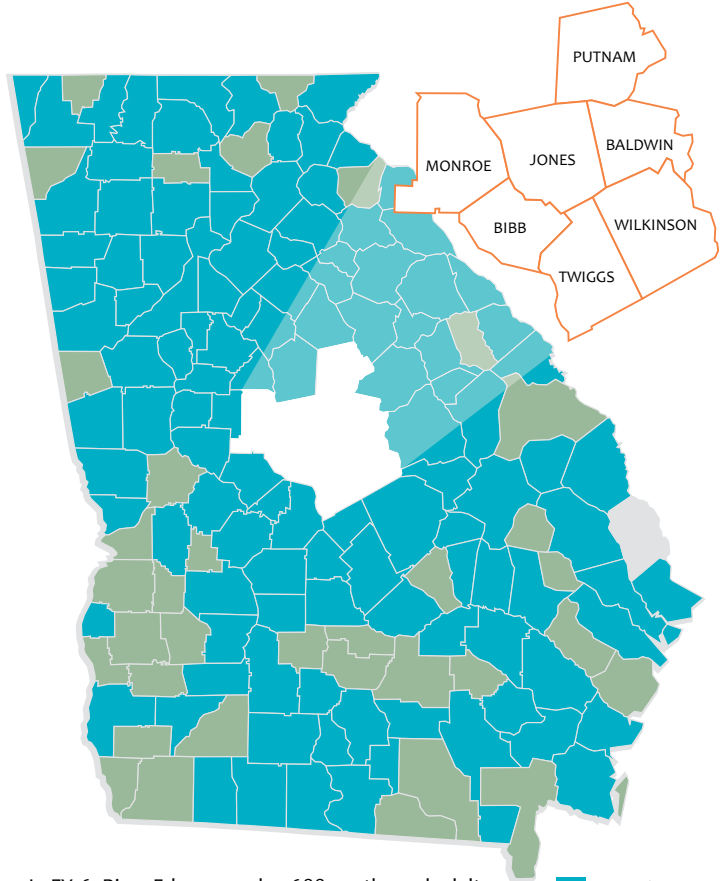
